TEL AVIV - BEN GURION AIRPORT TO RAMADA/ROYAL HOTEL, JERUSALEM


Welcome to Jerusalem! We are looking forward to greeting you. Below are directions and an explanation of how to buy tickets.






By Sherut (Shared Taxi Minivan) -

Sherut taxis (yellow and white minibusses) run 24/7 from outside the arrivals hall (exit 1 or 2 and turn left) at Terminal 3. They cost 80 NIS per person and deliver you to the hotel's doorstep. However, you may have to wait for it to fill up with additional passengers, and the journey will take additional time as people will be dropped off at different addresses within Jerusalem. There is no need to pre-book. However, it does need to be paid in cash (ILS). There is an ATM/Change window in the arrivals hall if needed.



Train and Transport

- The train from the airport to the Jerusalem Yitzchak Navon station runs every half hour during the day and every hour during the nighttime hours.
- After exiting the Arrivals Hall, follow the signs to the train station. Please keep your ticket/Rav Kav as you will need it at the entrance and exit.
- After arriving at the Yitzchak Navon Jerusalem Station, exit via escalator or lift to Jaffa Street. Take a taxi from the train station (taxis will be waiting on the nearby road) or take the light rail 1 stop to Kiryat Moshe. (See map below) From there, it is a 9-minute walk to the hotel.



Train and Foot

- The train from the airport to the Jerusalem Yitzchak Navon station runs every half hour during the day and every hour during the nighttime hours.
- After exiting into the Arrivals Hall, follow the signs to the train station. Keep your ticket/Rav Kav as you will need it both at the entrance and exit. Explanation on buying a ticket below.
- After arriving at the Yitzchak Navon Jerusalem Station, exit via escalator or lift to Jaffa Street. If you are connected to GPS on a smartphone, a Google Map with directions to the Ramada can be downloaded before your arrival to ensure a clear passage. It takes 15-20 minutes walk to arrive.

Buying Tickets

- You can buy single train and light rail tickets at train stations; however, we recommend purchasing a Rav Kav.
 The Rav Kav is a Transport Card used for all public transport in Israel. as riding buses can only be done with prepurchased credit (Rav Kavs).
- Buying a Rav Kav at Tel Aviv Airport:
- Ticket: to buy a 'Rav Kav' a public transport card, there is a window inside the arrivals hall next to exit 1. The office is open 24 hours a day except Fridays (open till 14:30) and Saturdays (open after 21:00).
- If you are not a citizen of Israel, the easiest option is to request an anonymous Rav Kav. This can be bought and topped up at the service window.
- Rav Kavs can also be bought and "topped up" at light rail stations in Jerusalem.





Buying Tickets

- There are multiple options for top-up:
- One Way Ticket (Specify Train or Bus).
 The cost for a train ride from Ben Gurion Intl Airport to Jerusalem Yitzchak Navon is 19 NIS.
 The cost for a bus or light rail ride within Jerusalem is 6 NIS.
- "Erech Tzavur" Credit that may be used for all methods of public transport.
- "Chofshi Yomi" Day Pass.
